The main objective of the Environmentally Sustainable Transport (EST) initiative is to built a common understanding across the regions (Asia, Africa and Latin America and the Caribbean) on the essential elements of the EST and the need to adopt an integrated approach at national and local levels to deal with multi-sectoral environment and transport issues in the context of sustainable development. Through this initiative:

- (1) The Bangkok 2020 Declaration (2010-2020) and Bogotá Declaration will be implemented in Asia and Latin American and the Caribbean region respectively: This will lead to:
 - a. accomplish safe, secure, quick, reliable, affordable, efficient, people-centric and environment friendly transport system to promote sustainable development
 - b. foster economical, social and environmental development
 - integrate developing countries in the world economy and contribute the eradication of poverty.
- (2) The Africa EST Forum will be established with an objective to address the same for the African region .

Briefly describe how will this commitment be achieved (max 200 words):

UNCRD, in collaboration with partners, international organizations, bilateral/multi-lateral donors, including development banks, provides substantive support for developing countries;

- by providing advisory services, promoting cooperation, raising awareness, establish regional networking, substantive support for capacity building and technical support to the developing countries by organizing forums, training courses, workshops, seminars on relevant subjects to achieve sustainable development at the local/regional level.
- by motivating government authorities to take the initiative in formulating appropriate policies and programs towards sustainable transportation through high level policy forums,
- by promoting further interagency coordination, collaboration and partnership with the governments to deal with multi-sectoral environment and transport issues.

The goals and objectives of the Bangkok Declaration as well as Bogotá Declaration will be achieved mainly through the promotion of:

- (a) **Strategies to avoiding unnecessary travel and reduce trip distances:** Including integrate land-use planning, related institution arrangement, achieve mixed-use development in cities and using information and communication including wide-scale improvements to pedestrian and bicycle facilities;
- (b) **Strategies to sift towards more sustainable modes:** applying non-motorized transport component in transport master plan, improve public transport services and implementation of transport demand management (TDM) including high quality, affordable and more sustainable transport modes;
- (c) **strategies to Improve transport practices and technologies**: inducing vehicle technology, affordable fuel quality, freight transport efficiency, inspection and maintenance; adopting intelligent transport system, zero fatality policy, energy security policy; monitoring health impacts from transport emission, noise and air pollution; adopting social equity, promoting good governance; providing accurate information and awareness, and establishing necessary infrastructure and intuitions
