




Figure 1: Regional distribution of **32** events organized/coorganized by SLoCaT in 2016





Figure 2: Regional Distribution of **40** events SLoCaT Participated in 2016

- Translate objectives into rolling short and medium term goals to prioritize actions and evaluate success – status: planning 2017 – 2018, will contain a medium and long term perspective
- Reaffirm open critical approach to technology: decisions and work plans conform to this approach status: no direct planned activities, to be reflected in future planning and the manner in which SLoCaT programs and projects are implemented
- Pursue active membership from developing countries status: review of current status calls for more pro-active approach, e.g. Board Committee on Membership engagement
- Remove inactive members and implement membership fee system status: is being implemented in incremental steps
- Develop succession plan for SG and key Board Members, possibly strengthening the capacity of the Secretariat status: Secretariat has been strengthened, succession plan for SG and key Board members is outstanding
- Establish a Gender Participation Action Plan and roll out status: Propose to be included in the planning for 2017-2018. In interim emphasis has been given to raising number of female speakers at various events in 2016 (Habitat III and COP22)
- Review ways to improve members and partners' involvement and increased sharing of work among members – status: SLoCaT has now started monitoring membership engagement in an active manner




SLoCaT Member Engagement


As per mid-December, 71 out of 91 members engaged in at least one SLoCaT activity in 2016. This means 78% is directly or indirectly involved.

What is at Stake?



Climate Change:

- Current Transport GHG emissions are 7.7 Gt
- 2050 BAU emissions possibly 13-15
 Gt
- 2050 emission levels based on Paris Agreement associated with well below 2 Degree Celsius target can be only 2-3 Gt

Sustainable Development:

- 1 billion without access to all season roads
- Urban population will grow by 2.3
 billion up to 2050
- 1.3 million killed in Road accidents
- Million + people die annually from transport related air pollution




Overarching Principles driving SLoCaT Work Program 2017 - 2018

- **Transformational change** Maintaining a dual but interlinked approach on sustainable development and climate change
- From Policy Advocacy to facilitating delivery Operational strategies for transport related goals and targets set by the Paris Agreement, SDGs, NUA and other international agreements
- Combined Short term action with long term policies -Combine short term actions to initiate change with medium-, and long term transformation policies
- Exploiting international policy process milestones the High Level Political Forum in July 2018 (review of SDG 11) and the 2018 Facilitative Dialogue (UNFCCC)
- Collaborative approaches Builds partnerships with other sectors that are key to the realization of transport related goals. Balances outreach to, and engagement with, public sector and private sector. How countries and cities can develop and implement policies, programs and projects
- **SLoCaT's evolution** *SLoCaT needs to engage with a variety of existing and emerging institutional structures and agree how best they can work together in the interests of sustainable transport.*





Key Global Functions in Support of Scaled-up Transformative Change in Sustainable Transport



SLoCaT Retreat October 2016:

- Vision and Leadership: Translate and interpret global vision and targets into understandable and implementation orientated policies and plans,
- National and local Mobilisation / Best Practise and Guidance: Inspire and enable (financing, capacity building, knowledge transfer) actors at all levels of authorities, private sector and civil society,
- Indicators, Monitoring and Reporting:
 Ensure that policy, decision making, prioritisation and funding allocation will all be evidence based,
- Co-ordination and Stakeholder
 Engagement: Strong co-ordination of influential stakeholders to champion change towards sustainable mobility,
- Financing: a) Inform, influence global, national, local, public and private decision makers to finance /support sustainable transport; b) Inform/influence global funders/funds to support sustainable transport.



Grand Global Partnership (GGP) or Sustainable Mobility for ALL (SUM4ALL)



- A GGP is necessary ("something needs to be done")
- It should be a high visibility, foreground institution
- All key sectors should be included (Global, regional, national, Local, NGO's, Private Sector etc.)
- Could be presented as the "next step" from UN SG HLG ST report of October 2016 "point of departure"
- Focus on "positive" forces
- Least Developed Countries also need to be included
- Incremental approach in building up institutional structure and governance

Effective GGP builds on, rather than replaces existing coalitions



SLoCaT and SUM4ALL

.....our approach

- Welcomes and will actively support the concept
- To avoid duplication and overlap SLoCaT should be actively involved in the development of SUM4ALL
- SLoCaT ready to take a leadership role in "Green" (environmental) part of SUM4ALL – this in context of PPMC
- Active coordination with SLoCaT members required to make certain potential is realized

IF DONE PROPERLY, SUM4ALL can be a game-changer for SLoCaT



SLoCaT and PPMC

- PPMC = Paris Process on Mobility and Climate, established in 2015 as a Partnership between SLoCaT and Michelin Challenge Bibendum (MCB)
- Rationale for PPMC: gain more impact - influence in UNFCCC process by partnering with private sector oriented network (well connected in France + Morocco)
- PPMC has been successful and helped to move transport from being a straggler to leader in UNFCC process
- It is in SLoCaT's interest to continue PPMC as separate joint program with MCB, aim for medium (2-3 years) integration in SLoCaT
- SLoCaT involvement in PPMC overseen by SLoCaT Board
